

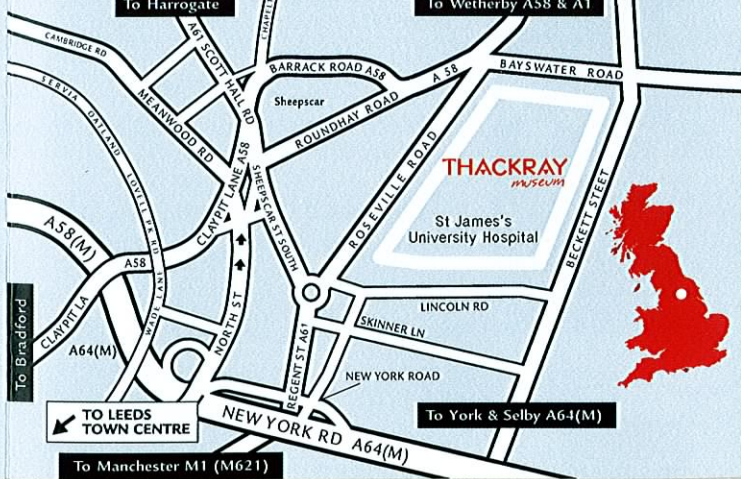


Course Content

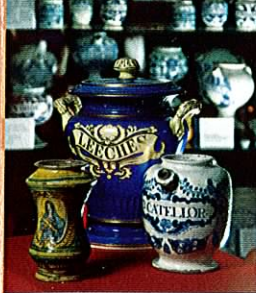
