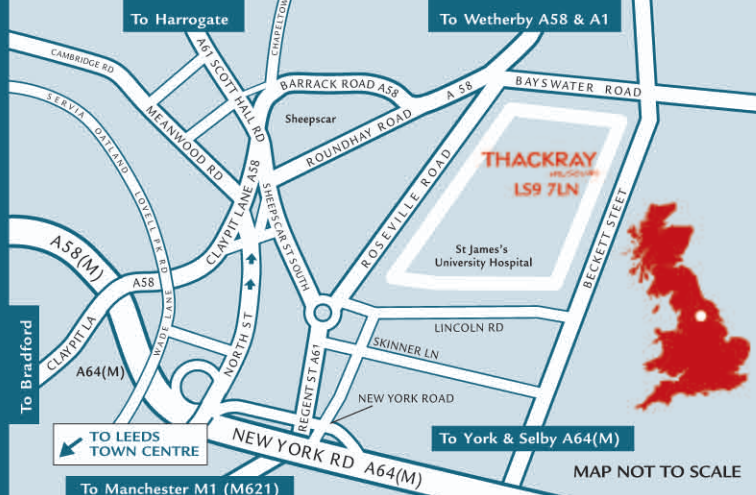




Course Content
